

GPDR (RODO)- Information Clause for Patients

1. The controller of your personal data is Uniwersyteckie Centrum Stomatologii i Medycyny Specjalistycznej Sp. z o.o. (Centre), located at Bukowska 70, 60-812 Poznań, email address: sekretariat@ucs.poznan.pl, phone number: (61) 854 7347, registered in the National Court Register under the number 0000496407, VAT ID: 779-241-95-79, REGON: 302639004. We have appointed a Data Protection Officer whom you can contact by emailing: iod@ucs.poznan.pl.
2. You have the right to access your personal data, to rectify them, request their erasure, or object to their processing due to your particular situation. You also have the right to request the restriction of processing of your data, as well as their portability.
3. If you believe that your personal data are being processed unlawfully, you have the right to lodge a complaint with the supervisory authority, which is the President of the Personal Data Protection Office (PUODO).
4. Your personal data will be processed for several different purposes, such as for the proper performance of the contract, for tax purposes, and may also be processed for the establishment, exercise, or defense of legal claims under civil law provisions, if they arise.
5. Providing your data is voluntary but necessary for the conclusion and performance of the contract.
6. The legal basis for processing your data is Article 6(1)(b) of Regulation (EU) 2016/679 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 27 April 2016 on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data, and repealing Directive 95/46/EC (General Data Protection Regulation) (EU Official Journal L 119 of 2016, page 1) – hereinafter referred to as GDPR (i.e., processing is necessary for the performance of a contract or for pre-contractual measures), Article 6(1)(c) of the GDPR (processing is necessary for compliance with a legal obligation incumbent on us, such as, for example, archiving obligation), and Article 9(2)(f) of the GDPR (i.e., processing is necessary for the establishment, exercise, or defense of legal claims).
7. Recipients of personal data will be entities to whom we are obliged to transfer data under applicable law, including the Tax Office, as well as entities providing services on our behalf in the field of medical diagnostics and consultations, accounting, transportation, courier and postal services.
8. We will process your personal data for the entire duration of the contract, and also thereafter until the expiry of the limitation period for any claims arising from the contract and in connection with the fulfillment of the 20 or 30-year archiving obligation.
